
Dear Mr. Rockefeller:

I understand that you were recently contacted by Mr. Greg Marshall, Chairman of the Argonauta Project, regarding a preservation effort that is underway to preserve and relocate the Maui home of Charles and Anne Morrow Lindbergh.

You may be interested to learn that Mr. Don Reeser, Superintendent of Haleakala National Park, has expressed the National Park Service's eagerness to accept the donation of the home, and has proposed plans for park improvements near the visitor center at Seven Pools (Ohe'o Pools). When the structures are completed, they will become a central part of the Kipahulu Conservation Center. The Conservation Center will contain relevant interpretive exhibits accessible to park visitors, and feature stories of the contributions of Charles Lindbergh, the Nature Conservancy and yourself.
